CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

The HOA is taking advantage of the City's offer to pick up Christmas trees at no charge. The City program allows the community to pick a space to drop off old Christmas trees and then the City will go and pick them up at no charge once they are called.



The Board has designated the parking space right outside of each exterior dumpster of each building for this tree disposal program. The spaces are clearly marked. This disposal is for live trees only and all ornaments and lights, tinsel, etc. must be removed. Residents please take care in personally cleaning up the trail after the transportation from your home to the disposal area. Christmas Tree bags can be purchased with your tree or even afterwards and by bagging the tree there is much less mess.

INTERIOR PIPE REPLACEMENT TO COINCIDE WITH YOUR REMODEL

In addition to the requirement that <u>all</u> construction and remodel work within a unit be presented to the Architectural Committee for pre-approval, there is an added benefit for the everyone. The HOA wants to eventually replace the piping in the walls and it makes the most sense to do this while your unit is being worked on. Please notify the HOA, through Manager Sarah, well in advance of your plans so that the committee can review and approve AND schedule this plumbing replacement to take place. Penalties, and in some cases removal of work that wasn't approved may result.

The washers and driers in all the common area laundry rooms operate on Laundry Cards only.

Coins are not accepted.

Replacement laundry cards are \$10 plus the cost of any pre-loaded funds (some cards are pre-loaded with \$3-

\$5). The fees can be posted to your account therefore all requests must be made by the owner.

To get a card send a written request to Sara: saraht@goldcoastmgt.com. Fax or regular mail will also work. Include the address of where you want the card mailed and the address of the on-site unit that the card is being issued for. She may also coordinate the pick up or delivery of the card between you and Kap. Please note, Kap will not be able to distribute the card without prior arrangement through Sara.

There are add value stations located in the lobby of each building where you can load additional funds onto your laundry card. You will need a credit or debit card and your laundry card to operate the add value stations to add value to your card. If you have any questions, please contact management.

The washers take energy efficient soap only. Please read the directions on the machine before using them. Do not misuse the machines! These new energy efficient machines and value cards may take getting used to but they save the HOA money by using less energy.

MOTORHOME PARKING

Unfortunately we cannot accommodate motor homes, campers or RV's in our parking lots but if you have visiting family



or friends who need a place to park overnight, parking is available at a designated spot at the Boat Launch Ramp on Victoria Ave. The fee is \$25 per night with payment being made through payment vaults situated on site. This is not a campground but rather a place where RV's can park on a temporary basis while launching their boat or using other harbor facilities. The Area is policed by the Channel Islands Harbor Patrol. For additional information contact Harbor Patrol at (805) 382-3007. Additionally boat tenants of Channel Islands Harbor Marina and Vintage Marina (and their affiliates) may obtain temporary RV parking passes from those marina offices. Our Anacapa Isle Marina does not offer this option.

TENNIS COURT USE

The vast Pacific Ocean in our backyard is larger than all the other world's seas combined, and many of life's woes seem so small from a perspective of just ten nautical miles offshore.
